

Chronic Sinusitis - What to Look For

We've all felt the pain of a *sinus infection*. The throbbing pressure, postnasal drip and congestion are just a few of the irritating symptoms in which we've been all familiar with. Many people get over their infection within a week or so, but for some of us it never stops. That week turns into a month, sometimes lengthier, and it seems as soon as they get better it comes right back. This is known as a chronic nose infection, even though the signs are similar to a serious sinus infection, they can be much worse. In some cases they can lead to serious problems in the event that they are not treated properly. Let us take a look at some of the differences between a serious infection and a chronic infection.



Acute Sinusitis Vs Persistent Sinusitis

As mentioned before, a severe sinus infection will last 7 to 10 days, and is generally triggered by a cold or the flu. Acute sinusitis is commonly the result of a cold or the flu, any time microorganisms become trapped within the nasal passages and sinus cavities. Thick greenish-yellow discharge is a sign of a severe sinus infection.

- **chronic sinus infection** may last up to 12 months or even longer.
- That is usually caused by a pre-existing condition such as sensitive rhinitis, or perhaps repeated acute infections.
- Signs are usually a lot more severe in the case of a **chronic sinus** infection, and so they include:

Clear, thin discharge - Extreme pressure and congestion - Headaches, especially when leaning forward or bending above - Halitosis (bad breath) - Soreness in the teeth and jaw - Postnasal drip

Treatment is Essential

When you are looking at longterm sinusitis, remedy is crucial due to the risk of the infection spreading to other parts of the head and body. The infection can spread to the ears, causing temporary (and occasionally permanent) hearing difficulties as well as the eyes which could lead to temporary or permanent perspective loss. In extreme cases, the infection can spread to the brain and spinal cord, which may end up being fatal.
